

### Faculty Position in the D3 Center, the University of Osaka

Outline	<p>In this open call for participants, the Language Education Support Research Division of the D3 Center plans to hire one professor to conduct research and education while engaging in the duties described below.</p> <p>The selected applicant will lead research and educational initiatives aimed at advancing ICT-supported language education environments. This aim includes developing foreign language learning systems and materials using ICT tools and technologies, as well as creating and implementing ICT-based language learning and teaching methodologies. The applicant will also actively promote collaborative learning by forming partnerships with domestic and international educational institutions through the use of ICT. Additionally, the applicant will contribute to education and research as a cooperative member of the Division of Language and Culture within the Graduate School of Humanities. This role involves supervising and instructing graduate students in the field of second language education. The applicant will also be responsible for language courses at the Center for Multilingual Education.</p> <p>As the Head of the division, the applicant will collaborate with the Cybermedia Education Research Division of the D3 Center and dedicate 35% of their efforts to university-wide educational support tasks. These tasks include designing and implementing advanced ICT-supported foreign language education environments, delivering ICT-assisted language education, and conducting faculty development to support ICT-based instruction. Please note that the nature of these university-wide support activities may evolve in response to changing circumstances.</p>
